

Proposals for social media platforms



TOOLS FOR USERS/PARENTS

- Provide parents with ways to manage what a young user sees online and to limit unwanted interactions. The tools, which should be activated by default for platforms that allow users below 18 to sign up, should also limit visibility of young users' profiles.
- Users should be able to manage their exposure to unwanted content. Details of helplines should be pushed to users who search for high-risk content, such as that related to self-harm.



MONITOR FOR ONLINE HARMS

- Set community standards for six types of content: Sexual, violent, self-harm, cyber bullying, content that endangers public health, and content that facilitates vice and organised crime.
- Have a simple way for users to report harmful content, and then take timely action. Platforms should actively detect and remove content related to child sexual exploitation, abuse and terrorism.



IMDA

- Give the authority power to order platforms to disable Singapore users' access to certain content such as content relating to public health or content that risks inciting racial tension. IMDA can also disallow specified online accounts from interacting with local users.
