Season highlights

- First player from Poland on the WTA and ATP tours to be world No. 1.
- Won 37 straight matches over 135 days, the longest streak on the WTA Tour since 1997.
- First female player to win two Grand Slams in a single season since 2016.





Ons Jabeur, 28, Tun

 46-15  2

- First Arab player, male or female, to reach a Grand Slam final.
- Reached her career-high ranking of world No. 2.
- Won her first WTA 1000 title in Madrid.





Coco Gauff, 18, USA

 38-19  0

- Youngest player to qualify for the WTA Finals since Maria Sharapova in 2005.
- Reached her career-high ranking of world No. 4.
- Made her first Grand Slam final at the French Open.





Caroline Garcia, 29, Fra

 41-19  3

- Second in number of titles won, behind Swiatek.
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces this season.
- Made her first Grand Slam semi-final at the US Open.





Daria Kasatkina, 25, Rus

 40-20  2

- Won two titles in a season for the second straight year.
- Made her first Grand Slam semi-final at the French Open.
- Advanced to the semi-finals or better at six tournaments, on all three surfaces.





Jessica Pegula, 28, USA

 42-18  1

- Highest-ranked American (third) since Sloane Stephens in 2019.
- Posted 39 wins at WTA-1000 level over the past two seasons, the most on tour.
- Won her first WTA 1000 title in Guadalajara.




Maria Sakkari, 27, Gre

 37-22  0

- Reached four finals, including two WTA-1000 events in Indian Wells and Guadalajara.
- Currently world No. 5, she is one of only three who started the year in the top 10 and remained.
- Made her first grass-court – her weakest surface – semi-final in Berlin.



Aryna Sabalenka, 24, Blr

 30-20  0

- First player to advance to consecutive US Open semi-finals since Serena Williams in 2019 and 2020.
- Reached two WTA 1000 semi-finals, in Rome and Cincinnati.
- Made her 17th career final in 's-Hertogenbosch.
