
# CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

A site nominated for World Heritage listing must illustrate one or more of these 10 values.

#### Site of exchange of important values



Illustrate an important interplay of human values on architecture or technology, monumental arts, town planning or landscape design.



The Botanic Gardens was where the cultivation and extraction of rubber were perfected, paving the way for the region's rubber trade boom.

#### **Historical landscapes**



Be an outstanding example of a type of building, technology or landscape which illustrates a significant stage in human history.

The Gardens had its roots as a colonial tropical garden.

#### **Natural beauty**



Contain superlative natural phenomena or exceptional beauty.

### Remnant of ancient civilisation

# **Ecological or biological significance**



Be an outstanding example of on-going ecological and biological processes in the evolution of various plant and animal ecosystems.





# THE **PROCESS**

# Drawing up a list

The State Party<sup>^</sup> prepares a Tentative List of national sites of notable universal value. These will be eligible to be submitted for inscription on the World Heritage List.



# Submission of documents

The State Party selects the site to be nominated. The nomination (which includes maps and documentation) and a plan on how the site will be conserved are put up to the Unesco World Heritage Centre.



# Reviews and recommendation

- The Centre reviews the dossier and checks that it is in order.
- Three appointed technical advisory bodies evaluate the documents and submit a proposal to the World Heritage Committee on whether to inscribe the site.



# **Committee decides**

The World Heritage Committee. which convenes yearly, decides on one of the following:

- Inscribe the site on the World Heritage List
- Refer or defer it (pending more information from the State Party)
- Reject inscription



# Upkeep of site

Authorities have to manage the inscribed site and provide periodic reports about on-site conservation and protection measures.

NOTE: ^A signatory to the World Heritage Convention, pledging to protect its cultural and natural heritage.
