TUNISIA

No. of deaths: 39 on June 26

- ISIS is attempting to undermine Tunisia's democratic and anti-extremist government with attacks targeting its economic strength, the tourist industry.

MALI

No. of deaths: 1 last weekend

- France led a military operation to drive militant group Al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb, out of northern Mali in 2013. However, the militants have intensified operations this year.

NIGERIA

No. of deaths: 200 last week, 71 since Sunday

- Boko Haram wants its own state in Nigeria's north. Newly elected President Muhammadu Buhari has promised to crush the insurgency.

CAMEROON

No. of deaths: 3 on Tuesday

- Cameroon, along with Niger and Chad, is in a regional military coalition with Nigeria fighting Boko Haram.

No. of deaths: More than 117 last Wednesday

- ISIS affiliates are targeting the Sinai Peninsula and Libyan border, apparently to cause disruption as the government tries to suppress the Muslim Brotherhood. Israel claims ISIS attacks also support Hamas attempts to smuggle arms into Gaza.
