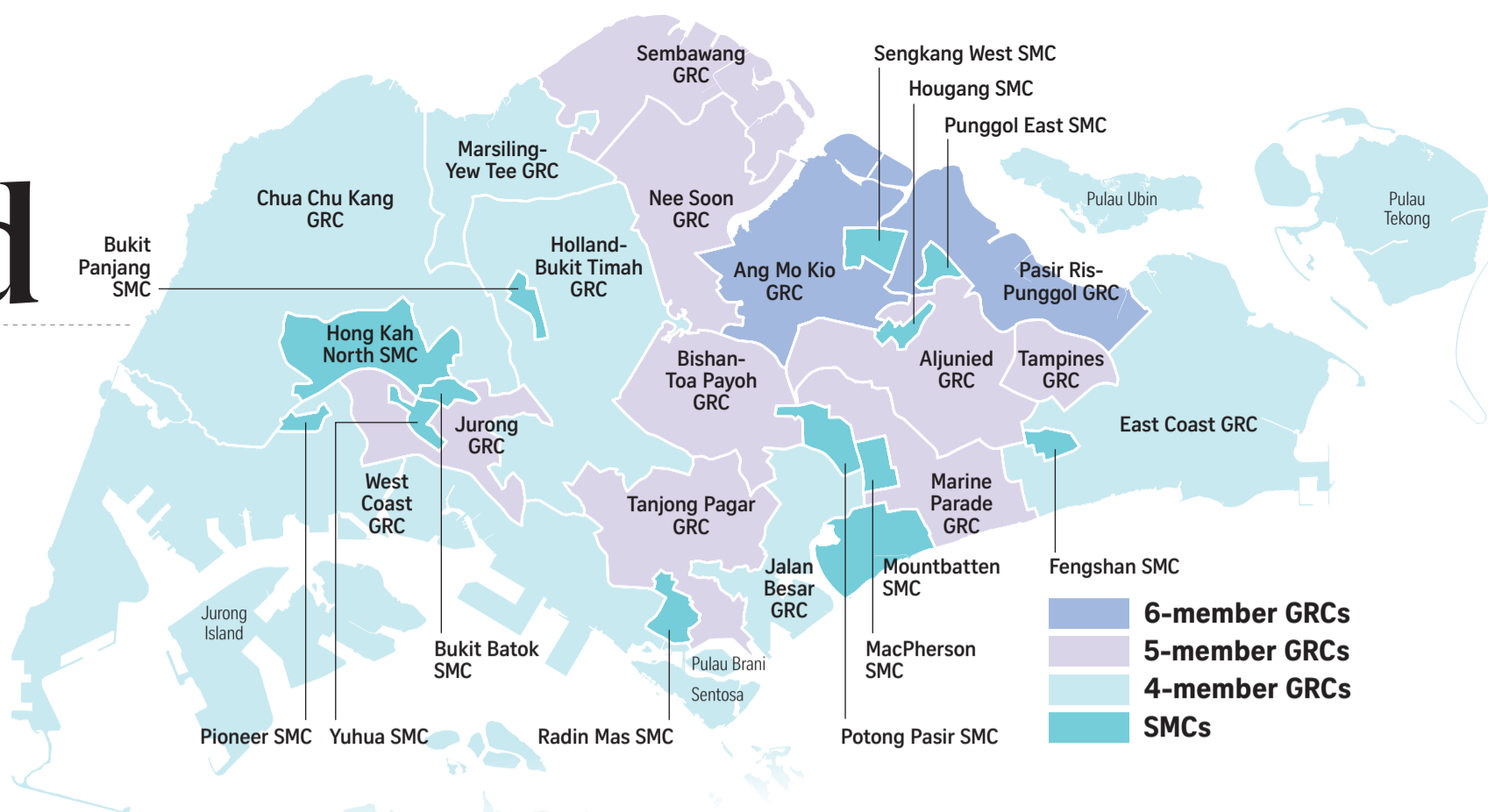

- The scene of the PAP's second-closest GRC win in 2011 is shaping up to be a hot battleground yet again, with the WP contesting there for the first time.
- It lost its MacPherson ward, carved out as a single-seat ward, and gained the former single seat of Joo Chiat, which the PAP won by a margin of just 388 votes in 2011.

- The PAP team led by Minister for Social and Family Development Tan Chuan-Jin also includes Emeritus Senior Minister Goh Chok Tong. It faces a WP team that comprises two lawyers, two entrepreneurs and a wealth manager.

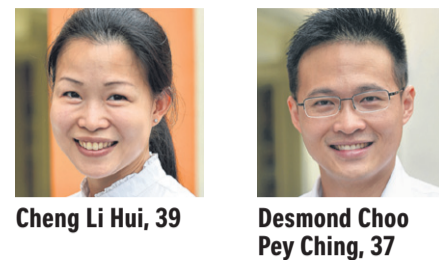
- It is the home ground of founding prime minister Lee Kuan Yew, who was MP in the Tanjong Pagar ward from 1955 until his death this year.

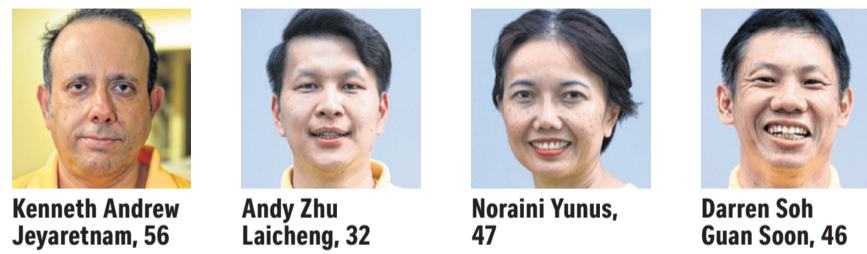

- The PAP team includes two Cabinet Ministers – Mr Lim Hng Kiang and Mr S. Iswaran – and faces an RP team that includes party chief Kenneth Jeyaretnam.

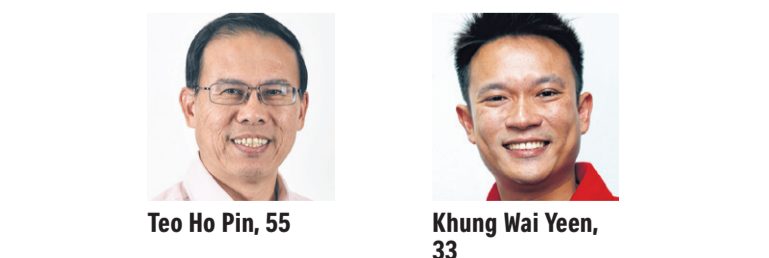
- The PAP saw narrow victories in Bukit Batok when it was a single seat in 1988 and 1991.

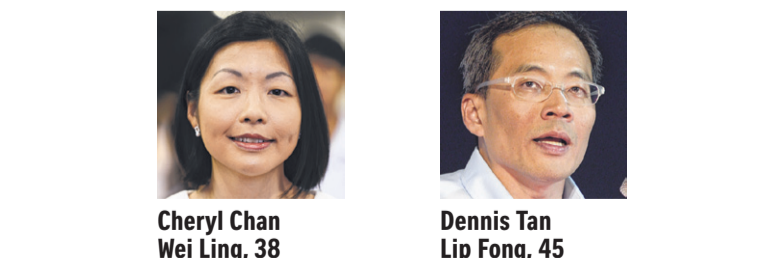
- Dr Teo Ho Pin has been MP for the ward since 1997. Since it became a single seat in 2006, he has consistently polled well above the PAP's national average.

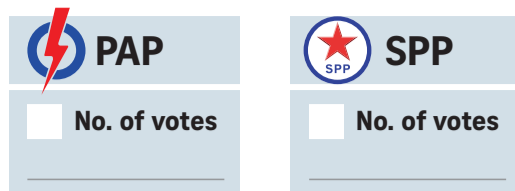
- Fengshan was last contested as a single seat in 1988.

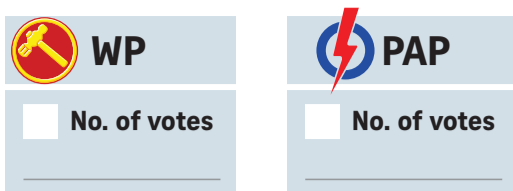

- Mr Png's opponent is former national gymnast Lee Hong Chuang.

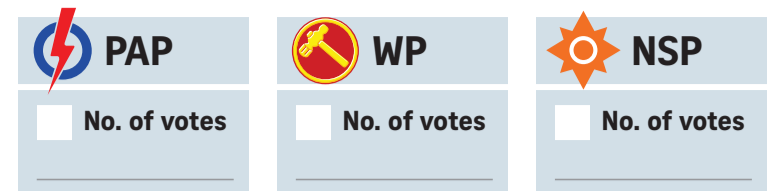

- It has a higher-than-average proportion of public rental residents and senior citizens, two groups traditionally seen as PAP supporters.
- Ms Tin Pei Ling of the PAP and Mr Bernard Chen of the WP, who are the youngest candidates of their respective parties this election, will face Mr Cheo Chai Chen, who was elected MP for Nee Soon Central on the SDP ticket in 1991.

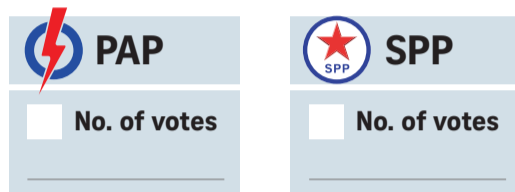

- A fairly new area that was just beginning to develop in the early 2000s, the ward has a larger-than-average share of public housing.

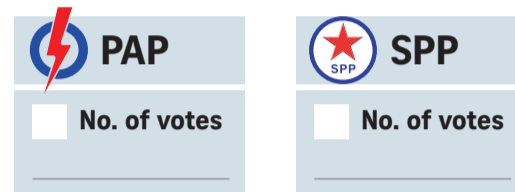

- With its boundaries untouched since 1984, the ward is by far the smallest this election.
- It fell to the PAP in 2011 when Mr Chiam left to contest Bishan-Toa Payoh GRC and his wife Lina Chiam contested instead. The PAP's Sitoh Yih Pin won by a razor-thin 114 votes.

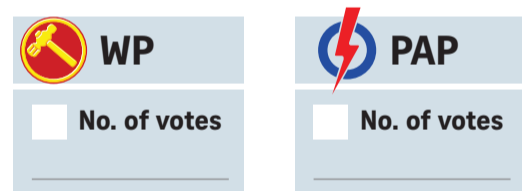

- Punggol East is a young estate with most of the flats there dating from after 1997. A majority of voters live in five-room and executive HDB flats or private apartments.
- Ms Lee's opponent this round is veteran MP Charles Chong, who is seeking a seventh term in Parliament.

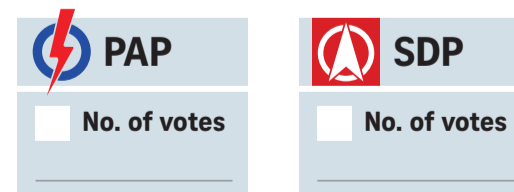

- Yuhua was a single-seat constituency until 1997, when it was absorbed into the now-defunct Bukit Timah GRC. It subsequently was part of Jurong GRC from 2001 to 2011, when it was carved out as a single-seat ward.
- Since 1984, the ward has had a female MP. Mrs Yu-Foo Yee Shoon represented the ward until 2006, followed by Ms Grace Fu, a Cabinet minister.
- The ward has seen a history of contests pitting two women against each other.
