








Is Asean close to becoming one community?




Do you see your work or travel increasing in the next three years after Asean becomes a community?






Do you identify with people in Asean?




How easy is it to do business across the region?









What will be the key hurdle in Asean's path towards one community?




Will your business do better once Asean becomes one community?
