Captain Morgan is a major reason why. He has emerged as a leader and an increasingly accomplished defender, especially when paired with Robert Huth.





Nabil Bentaleb v Gokhan Inler

Two who were expected to play much bigger roles this season. Bentaleb lost his place as the holding midfielder to Eric Dier while Inler has been overshadowed by fellow summer signing N'Golo Kante. Both could be given rare chances tomorrow, with each looking to exert control in the centre of the field and supply more to attacking players.





Kieran Trippier v Demarai Gray

Leicester were quick to sign in this transfer window. The 19-year-old winger Gray joined from Birmingham for £3.75 million (\$\$7.85 million). This could be the debut of a speedy, skilful player coveted by many clubs. Trippier excelled as a wing-back on his last outing, at Watford, but is likelier to return as an orthodox right-back if Kyle Walker is rested.



Cup of tea for Spurs



Tottenham have won the FA Cup eight times. Only Manchester United (11) and Arsenal (12) have won it more often. Spurs beat Leicester 2-0 in the 1961 final when they became the first club to do the Double in the 20th century.

Leicester are the only club to reach at least four FA Cup finals and never win one.
