## Aaron Ramseyv Cesc Fabregas

While Ramsey has two goals in his last three games, his former team-mate Fabregas had not scored and only mustered two assists in the league before a three-minute spell against Everton when he both scored and created one as a holding player. Hiddink may nevertheless pick him as a No. 10.


## Mesut Oezil v John Obi Mikel

Mikel has returned to favour under Hiddink. Now his task will be to stifle the most creative player in England, though Oezil has only one assist in his last four appearances and missed the Stoke game with a foot injury. Much rests on whether the Dutchman pairs Mikel with Nemanja Matic, or whether the Nigerian will be left to track Oezil on his own.


## Theo Walcott v Branislav Ivanovic

Ivanovic struggled last week when Everton overloaded the left with Leighton Baines, Kevin Mirallas and Ross Barkley. Arsenal may sense the chance of a repeat if Oezil can drift wide and Nacho Monreal can push wide to support Walcott. If the Englishman does not succeed, Wenger could have the option of replacing him with a fit-again Sanchez.
