
Areas affected

Zika landed in Latin America last year and has spread across virtually the

whole region via Aedes aegypti mosquitoes. Some countries have warned women to avoid getting pregnant as the virus has been blamed for causing birth defects.



Several areas in the Carribean have also reported active transmissions. Taiwan had its first reported case of the virus last week, while the virus has also been detected previously in Africa and South-east Asia, including Cambodia, Indonesia, the Philippines, East Malaysia and Thailand.
