

Proposals at a glance



Minimum number of opposition MPs to be increased

- Minimum of 12 opposition MPs, including Non-Constituency MPs (NCMPs), in Parliament, up from nine currently, from the next General Election
- NCMPs to get same voting rights as elected MPs
- The Nominated MP (NMP) scheme stays. There is provision for nine NMPs currently
- Together with the NCMP scheme, changes will ensure at least 21 non-ruling party MPs in the House



Smaller GRCs, more SMCs

- Average size of Group Representation Constituencies (GRCs) to be further reduced when boundaries are reviewed for the next General Election
- More Single Member Constituencies (SMCs) to be created at next GE



Review of Elected Presidency

- President to remain elected
- A Constitutional Commission will be appointed, headed by the Chief Justice
- It will look into bringing eligibility criteria up to date, strengthening the Council of Presidential Advisers, and ensuring that minorities have a chance to be elected
