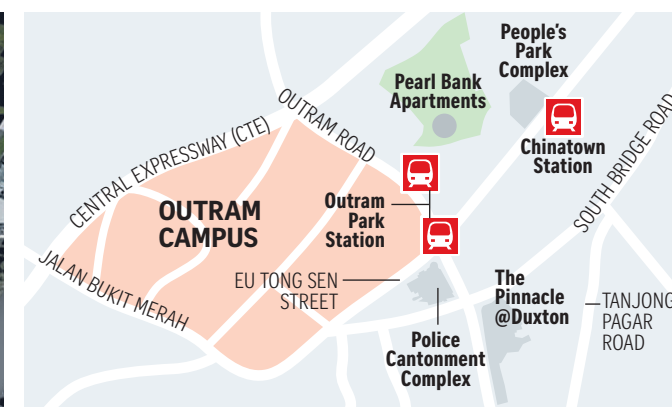


SGH's 20-year transformation

The Singapore General Hospital (SGH) campus will occupy 60 per cent of the Outram site, with an education zone helmed by Duke-NUS Medical School and a research park taking up the rest of the space. The hospital itself will move from its current location to the corner of Outram Road and Eu Tong Sen Street. Work on this is expected to span 20 years.



New NCCS

- With more than 20 storeys, the new National Cancer Centre Singapore will be the tallest building on the campus.
- Demand for cancer treatment is expected to surge as better treatment means patients live longer, but will continue to require follow-up care.



SGH Elective Care Centre

- Equipped with operating theatres, specialist outpatient clinics and hospital wards, it will treat non-emergency patients
- The building will also house the new National Dental Centre.



SGH A&E Block

- When the current facilities were built, it catered to fewer than 70,000 patients. Last year, it treated more than 135,000 patients.
- The new building is needed to cope with the growing patient load, till the hospital moves to its new premises.



Outram Community Hospital

- This 550-bed hospital, which will start taking in patients in 2020, will provide integrated care with SGH for patients needing rehabilitation before going home.
