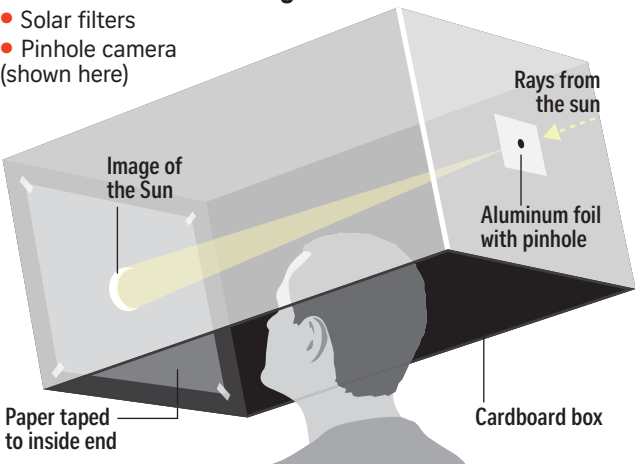


Your guide to the solar eclipse

People here will be able to witness an almost full eclipse on Wednesday, as the moon covers a large portion of the sun.

Safe methods of viewing

- Solar filters
- Pinhole camera (shown here)



When

- Eclipse starts at about 7.20am and ends at 9.30am, with maximum eclipse of 87% at 8.23am, on March 9.

Good places for viewing

- Open spaces or high places without obstructions to the east.
- The public can go to Science Centre Singapore or the football field at NUS Kent Ridge campus for eclipse-viewing sessions organised by the two institutions.
