1 Civilian War Memorial, Bras Basah Road & Beach Road intersection

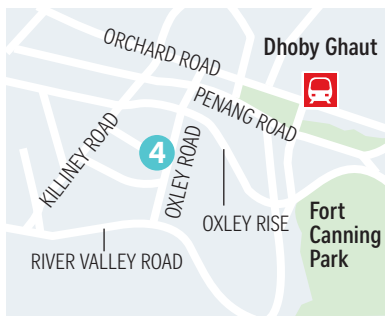
- The Civilian War Memorial pays tribute to the lives lost during the Japanese Occupation – a key experience that shaped Mr Lee's political aspirations.

2 National Gallery Singapore and Padang, 1 Saint Andrew's Road

- The National Gallery houses the City Hall chamber, in which Mr Lee and Singapore's first Cabinet were sworn in in 1959.

3 The Arts House @ The Old Parliament, 1 Old Parliament Lane

- The Old Parliament chamber and Mr Lee's personal office were where many of his key policies were formed.



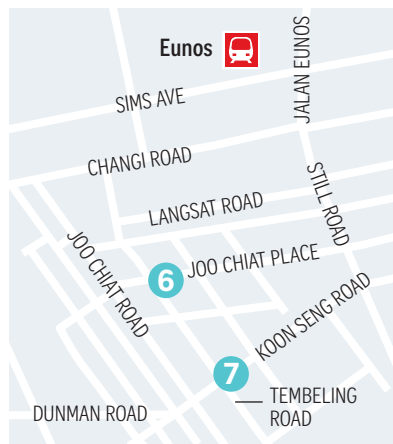
4 Lee Kuan Yew's home, 38 Oxley Road

- Mr Lee's home for over 50 years at Oxley Road reflected his frugal lifestyle that he wished to instil in his children.



5 Tanjong Pagar Plaza, 1 Tanjong Pagar Plaza

- Tanjong Pagar Plaza is part of the constituency that Mr Lee represented for nearly 60 years.



6 Guan Hoe Soon Restaurant, 38/40 Joo Chiat Place

- Guan Hoe Soon Restaurant was one of Mr Lee's favourite restaurants from where he ordered otak-otak and other dishes for Istana events.

7 Koon Seng Road and Tembeling Road area

- Tembeling Road, the area of Mr Lee's childhood home, traces his Peranakan roots and his role as the family's eldest son.
