

# BIGGEST PLUS FACTOR by Lee

By CHIA POTEIK

LEE KUAN YEW yesterday told a packed gathering of top executives and officials from various parts of the world that the political climate in South-east Asia today is the biggest plus factor for rapid development in the region.

The Prime Minister, who was making the closing speech at the end of the three-day conference at Shangri-La Hotel on Business Opportunities in the Pacific Basin, said:

### Devastation

"South-east Asia has learnt the terrible lessons of conflict. The ruin and devastation that have overwhelmed both North and South Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia, are in striking contrast to the steady and rapid progress of Thailand, Malaysia and Singapore.

"This is very much in the consciousness of the leaders and of the peoples of the countries in South-east Asia.

"Then there is the experience of the Indonesian people. After nearly 20 pro-fligate years under the late Dr. Soekarno, Indonesia, after painful beginnings, has now set course for economic development, seeking investments and rapid

### **Optimism**

Indicating his optimism about the region's continued stability, Mr. Lee said: "The prospect for stability and rapid growth is more than fair on the western rim of the Pacific Basin.

"For South-east Asia in particular, in-puts of capital and technology from Japan, America and Western Europe will increase this rate of growth."

Only two riders clouded the horizon, population growth and the problem of guerilla insurgency.

Population growth rates in most Southeast Asian countries were still too high, running, at between 24 and 34 per cent. This did not bode well for long-term progress and political stability, though this trend might
