N'Golo Kante v Gylfi Sigurdsson

The destroyer against the creator. Defensive midfielder Kante is one of the players of the season and attacking midfielder Sigurdsson one of the best in 2016, when he has fired Swansea to safety. Francesco Guidolin has compared Sigurdsson to Alexis Sanchez and his 4-2-3-1 formation gives them a spare man in midfield, testing Kante's energy.





Danny Simpson v Jefferson Montero

Montero is a mercurial performer but a brilliant one at his best. The electric Ecuadorian winger has already tormented Chelsea twice this season. Simpson's task in stopping him is rendered tougher because Mahrez does not shield his full-back as well as the diligent Marc Albrighton does on the other flank. He may be left on his own.
