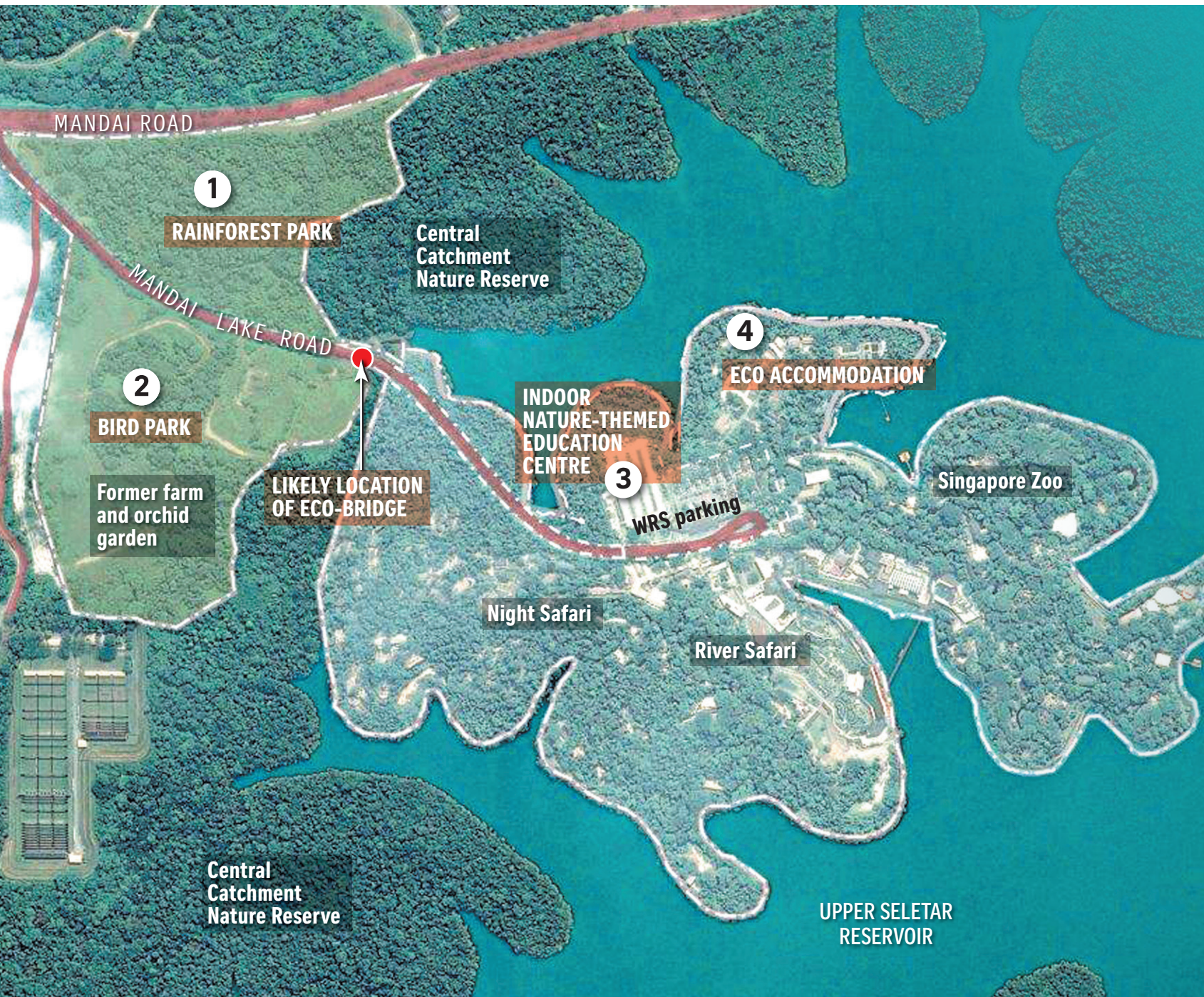


# What visitors can expect

Mandai is set to become bigger and better, with plans under way to turn it into a 126ha eco-tourism hub. The area, which houses the Singapore Zoo, River Safari and Night Safari, will feature two new attractions — the Bird Park, which will be relocated from Jurong, and the Rainforest Park.

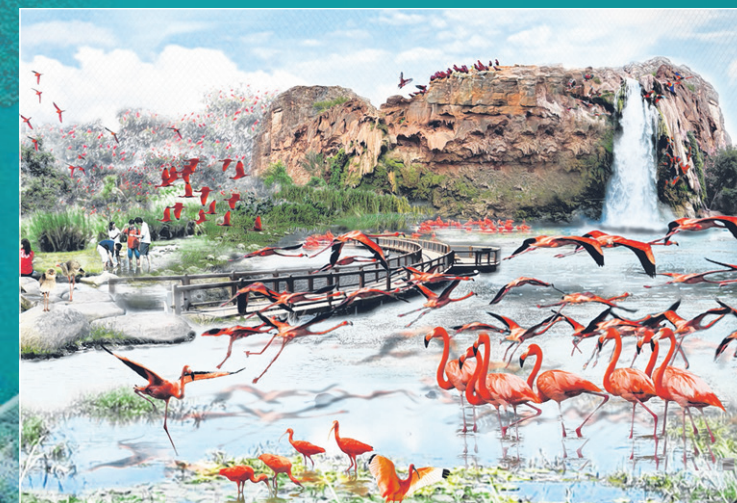


## 1 RAINFOREST PARK

A 12.5ha park with aerial walkways that extend from the forest floor to the tree canopies. Hanging pods will allow visitors to relax while enjoying the rainforest environment.

## 2 BIRD PARK

The 17ha Bird Park (below), which will be relocated from Jurong, is where visitors can observe birds in their natural environments at nine aviaries, with different landscapes from around the world, such as wetlands, bamboo forests and rainforests.



## 3 INDOOR NATURE-THEMED EDUCATION CENTRE

A learning facility with live camera feeds of the animals in their habitats, recordings of surgical treatments, and fixed or rotating exhibits.

## 4 ECO ACCOMMODATION

Camps, tents, cottages and family rooms where people can spend a night or two.

## ECO-BRIDGE FOR ANIMALS ACROSS MANDAI LAKE ROAD THAT WILL LINK THE NATURE RESERVE

Similar to the one over the Bukit Timah Expressway, the eco-bridge, spanning Mandai Lake Road, will link the central and northern parts of the Central Catchment Nature Reserve, which the Mandai area sits outside of.
