
Boxgreen. Social enterprises such as Singapore's Boxgreen, which sells healthy snacks in a monthly subscription box, are among the highlights at The Good Market.



The Singapore Coffee Festival at the F1 Pit Building will be open to the public from Friday to Sunday from 11am to 9pm.

VIP tickets on sale at \$43 include access to the VIP lounge with complimentary cocktail and canapes.
