MEMORABLE MAJOR TOURNAMENTS

• 1966 World Cup: Led by an inspired Eusebio, Portugal knocked holders Brazil out in the group stage, then came back from 0-3 down to beat North Korea 5-3. Unfortunately, Eusebio was nullified by Nobby Stiles as England edged them 2-0 in the semi-finals.

• Euro 2004: Hosting a major tournament for the first time, Portugal went all the way to the final, even though their so-called Golden Generation (Luis Figo, Nuno Gomes and Rui Costa) were on their last legs. Despite featuring a young Cristiano Ronaldo, Portugal were unable to find a way past Greece in the final, losing 0-1.

Cristiano _v Samuel Umtiti Ronaldo

A few weeks ago, Umtiti was probably France's ninth-choice centre-back. He was uncapped until the quarter-final. But the new Barcelona signing may have to get used to facing Real Madrid's Ronaldo. He was a solid presence against Germany. The unflagging Ronaldo, forever shooting and with his aerial ability, is a stiffer test.

Antoine Pepe Griezmann

They met six weeks ago in the Champions League final, when Pepe and Real Madrid came out on top and Griezmann missed a penalty. Now the Portuguese is perhaps the best centre-back in Euro 2016 and Griezmann much its finest striker. He darts around target man Olivier Giroud intelligently with terrific movement and wonderful finishing.

Now the set-piece specialist has been the most creative player in Euro 2016. Soares will have to work out when to pass him on to William Carvalho or Joao Mario.

Adrien Blaise V Silva Matuidi

Matuidi began the tournament in undistinguished form but improved when Kante went off against Ireland and he assumed more responsibility. The selfless Silva did a fine job of harrying Croatia's Luka Modric and may be asked to repeat that to stifle Matuidi, though he could also be detailed to track Pogba or Moussa Sissoko.

Didier Deschamps could become the second person to win the European Championships as a player and as a manager, after Berti Vogts (player in 1972, coach in 1996).
