Alarm pill box

 An audio alarm reminds users when to take their pills.

Adaptive cutlery The larger handles allow for easier grip





Home automation



Container lids with pop-up buttons

 Users press a button to seal the container, and press it again to open; useful for people without fine motor skills.

Liquid level indicator

• Beeps and vibrates when in contact with liquid; prevents people with poor vision from pouring water till it overflows.

Portable magnifier

 Users can click to zoom in to magnify text; device also has software to read text aloud to blind people.



Simplified keyboard with colour contrast and key guard

 Fewer keys for people with intellectual disabilities; colour contrast for people with poor vision; key guard is useful for people without fine motor skills.
