TP's men in black

The Traffic Police's month-old "stealth bike" team has been clamping down on road offenders — particularly errant motorcyclists. In their first month of operation, TP's stealth motorcycle officers detected more than 700 violations – including offences such as using a mobile phone while driving and reckless riding. In a video released on Monday, a few cases were highlighted.





DANGEROUS/RECKLESS RIDING

A motorcyclist on the right lane cuts across all the way to an exit on the left. In another incident, a motorcyclist does a U-turn within the same road.

Penalty: First offence incurs a fine of up to \$3,000 or imprisonment up to 12 months, or both. Repeat offence incurs a fine of up to \$5,000 or imprisonment up to two years, or both.



DRIVING WHILE USING A MOBILE PHONE

Covert officers spot a driver using his phone.

Penalty: First-time offenders are fined up to \$1,000 or jailed for up to six months, or both. Repeat offenders are fined up to \$2,000 or jailed for up to 12 months, or both.



SPEEDING

A truck is seen speeding and failing to keep left. **Penalty:** Speeding warrants a fine of up to \$200 and up to 24 demerit points.
