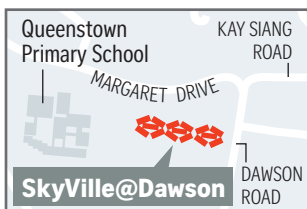


Sky-high and waterway living

Two iconic public housing developments are among 11 winning projects in this year's HDB Design Awards, which are given to architectural consultants which have worked on Housing Board projects.

Three 47-storey blocks with 960 units
Woha Architects won for this community-centric, greenery-filled project in Queenstown.



Sky gardens

Under a "Sky Village" concept, each cluster of 80 homes shares a high-rise sky garden where residents can relax and mingle.



Heritage

Specially-commissioned art panels capture the heritage of the Queenstown area.



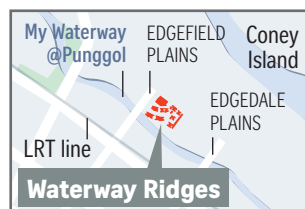
Roof garden

A roof garden links the 47th floor of all three blocks, with a 400m jogging track and seating for residents to enjoy the views.



Waterway Ridges

Seven blocks of six to 18 storeys, with 832 units
Surbana Jurong Consultants won for this landscaped project near My Waterway@Punggol.



Flowing down

The heights and orientations of the blocks are staggered for optimal views down to the waterway.



Water-filled landscape

Up to 70 per cent of the rainwater that falls across this project is channelled down to the waterway, with the help of special design features under PUB's Active, Beautiful, Clean Waters programme. Rain gardens and vegetated swales - marshy areas of land - fill up temporarily with water when it rains, becoming ponds, before draining the water down. Dry pathways also turn into streams, for added water features.
