

Forest town

The first new Housing Board town in two decades, Tengah will be a nature-lover's paradise with green features such as a 5km forest corridor, community farmways and a car-free town centre. Each of its five public housing districts will have a distinctive concept and feel.

PLANNED FEATURES



Car-free town centre

Tengah's car-free town centre, named Market Place, will be set in a lush park with vehicles running underneath instead.



Community farmways

Running through the housing estates, these corridors provide places for residents to play, farm, exercise and enjoy the greenery.



Central Park

At the heart of the town is a 20ha Central Park, with features such as a forest amphitheatre. An existing canal will be transformed into a "forest stream".

Forest corridor

The 100m-wide, 5km-long corridor forms part of a larger green network linking the western and central catchment areas.

Smart town

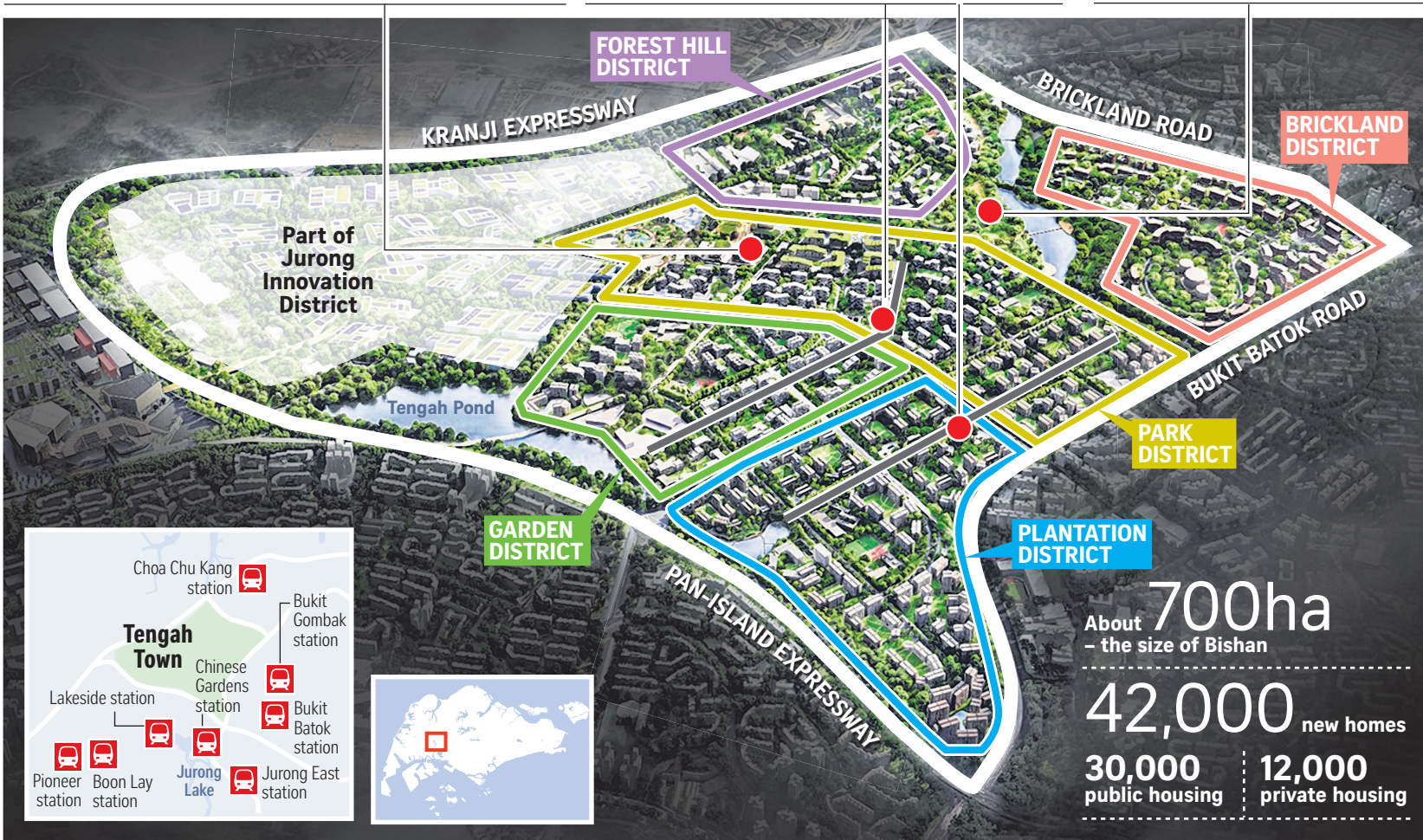
Information technology will guide the development of Tengah, from computer simulations to sensors that capture information such as temperature and humidity.

Walking and cycling

All roads in Tengah will have dedicated walking and cycling paths on both sides.

Transport links

The eventual Jurong Region Line will connect Tengah to the rest of the island.



FOREST HILL DISTRICT

Bordered by the forest corridor on two sides and Central Park on another, this district will bring nature to residents' doorsteps.

PARK DISTRICT

Next to the forest corridor and Central Park, this district will contain Tengah's car-free town centre.

GARDEN DISTRICT

A landscaped community farmway will run through the housing estates here, with gardens, play areas, community farms and more.



PLANTATION DISTRICT

Featuring waterfront housing and a community farmway, this will be the first district to be developed, with the first flats launched in 2018.



BRICKLAND DISTRICT

In their design, housing blocks here could draw inspiration from the brick factories that used to be there.
