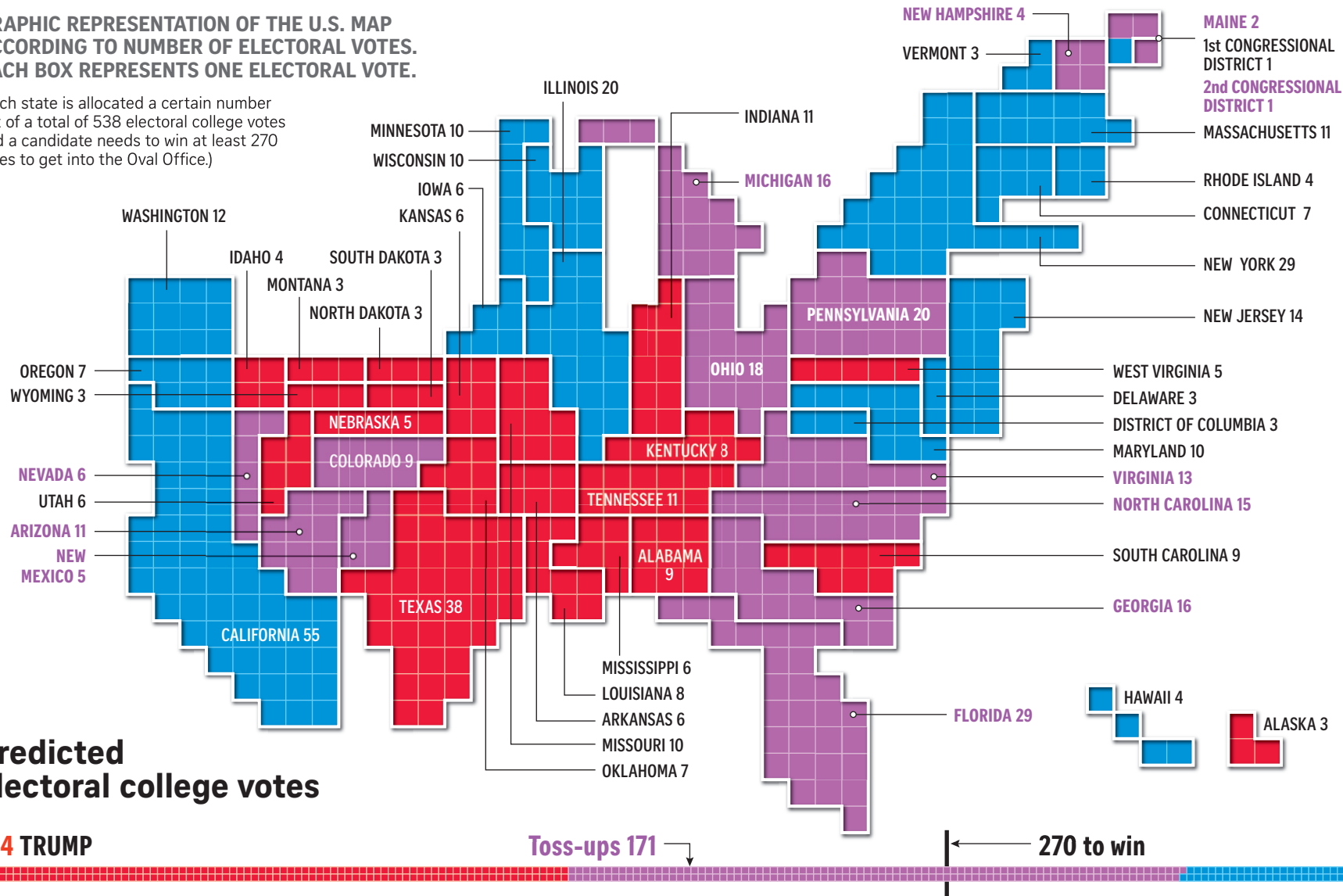


**GRAPHIC REPRESENTATION OF THE U.S. MAP

Election results today

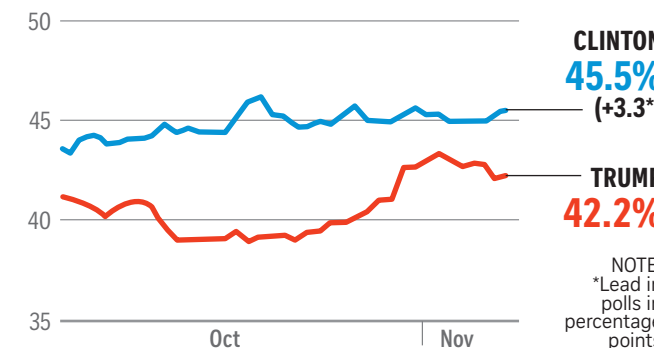
Chance of winning

(The New York Times derived the probability from the voting history of each state, as well as state and national polls conducted since mid-April. Figures as of yesterday.)



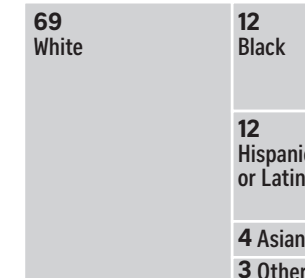
National opinion polls
