

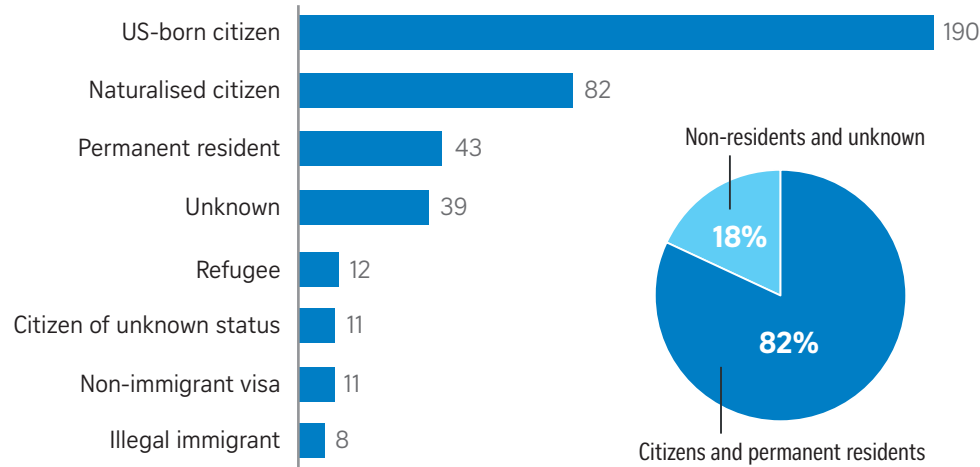
US temporary travel ban

On Jan 27, US President Donald Trump imposed a temporary ban on allowing refugees into the country, an indefinite ban on refugees from Syria, and a 90-day ban on citizens from seven Muslim-majority countries, citing national security reasons.

BY THE NUMBERS

0 Number of people from the seven countries included in the ban who have killed anyone in a terror attack on US soil in the last 40 years. This includes refugees.

10% of legal immigrants coming to the US are Muslim.

17 people from the seven countries included in the ban were convicted of trying or taking part in terror attacks on US soil over the last 40 years.

7.7 million

non-immigrants entered and left the US in 2015. These include people like tourists, business travellers, students and some relatives of US citizens. They also include workers with H-1B visas given to people with specialty occupations.

730,259 people became naturalised citizens of the US in 2015.

84,995 refugees and asylum-seekers were admitted to the US in 2016. Of this, a record number were Muslim refugees (38,901).
