- The Bureau of Labour Statistics estimates about 7.6 million people were unemployed in January.

One-fourth of US manufacturing jobs lost since North American Free Trade Agreement was approved

- US has lost a lot of factory jobs since 2000, but to technological progress, not foreign competition.
- Manufacturing output is at its highest level in history.
