How TADM helps workers

Tripartite Alliance for Dispute Management (TADM) will mediate disputes for more types of workers and provide additional support



Ms Tan • Engineer

- Earns \$7,000 per month. Owed 1 month's salary
- Not covered by the Employment Act
- Not covered by the Employment Act



- 1. She pays \$10 fee online to register her claim.*
- 2. TADM sets up a date, time and venue for mediation.
- **3.** A fair and amicable settlement is reached. TADM can also help Ms Tan register the agreement with the State Courts.



Mr John

- · Lost his job as a security guard
- Was earning \$1,600 a month, owed 2 months' overtime pay. Unable to find a new job
- Does not know exact amount he is owed



- 1. He makes an appointment online or in person. TADM officer links him up to the Employment and Employability Institute for job help and offers to refer him to a Social Service Office.
- 2. TADM officer helps determine amount owed for Mr John to register claim.**
- **3.** TADM sets up a date, time and venue for mediation. Employer can't pay as the business has failed.
- **4.** TADM guides Mr John to apply for the Short-Term Relief Fund to get up to \$1,000.
- 5. TADM issues a claim referral certificate for the Employment Claims Tribunals ***

NOTE:

*Claim limit for non-union members is \$20,000. Claims must be made within one year of the dispute, or six months of leaving the company.

**Low-wage workers can register their claim for free.

***After a judgment order is issued, TADM will monitor if payment is made. It can refer the case to the Manpower Ministry for enforcement if necessary.
