AERODYNAMICS

 Front wings are wider, to 1,800mm from a previous 1,650mm. Rear wings are also wider but lower, helping to give the cars a more aggressive look. Cars are wider, longer and heavier. The total width has been expanded to 2,000mm, a return to pre-1988 dimensions. They are also 20kg heavier at 722kg and 'shark fins' have appeared on most of them, leading off the airbox behind the driver's head.

 Fatter. Width of the rears has expanded from 325mm to 405mm. Fronts are 305mm from 245mm last season. Pirelli expects tyres to offer about 25 per cent more grip and last longer, which is likely to mean fewer pit stops.
