Las Vegas shooting: Some key details


The deadliest mass shooting in US history was facilitated by a massive arsenal and a high vantage point

- Shooting started on Sunday, at 10.08pm (local time)
- At least 59 people were killed and more than 500 injured
- Shooter was on the 32nd floor of Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino
- Gunman found dead when police breached hotel room




THE GUNMAN

- Stephen Paddock, 64
- Residence: Mesquite, Nevada
- Former accountant, licensed private pilot
- Regular video poker player, known to be wealthy, not known for any religious or political affiliation



THE ARSENAL

 Some of the firearms had scopes, while two were reportedly modified to make them fully automatic using a "bump stock". Automatic weapons are heavily regulated in the US, but a bump stock is a legal attachment for a weapon that allows a semi-automatic weapon to fire up to 400 to 800 rounds in a minute.



• Paddock also had two rifles mounted on tripods, to keep them steady for firing.

• Officers recovered several pounds of ammonium nitrate, a chemical used to make explosives, from Paddock's car.

 Explosives, 19 firearms and several thousand rounds of ammo were also recovered from his home in Mesquite, Nevada.
