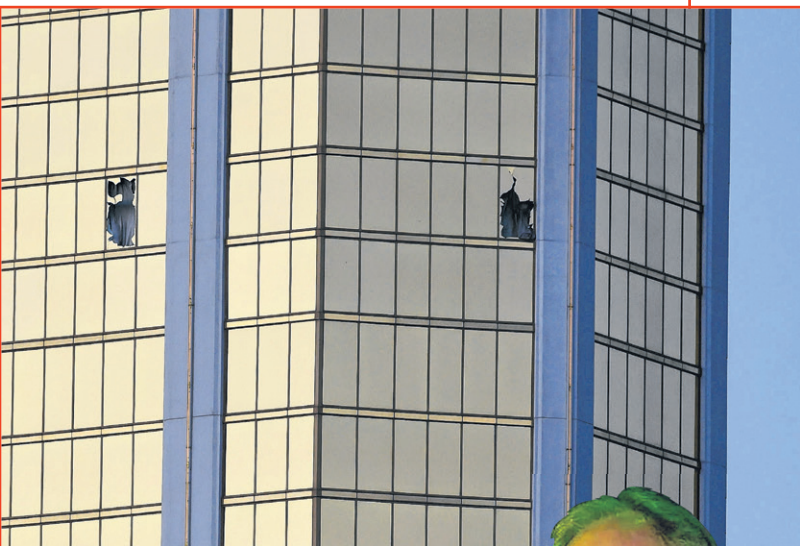


# Las Vegas shooting: Some key details

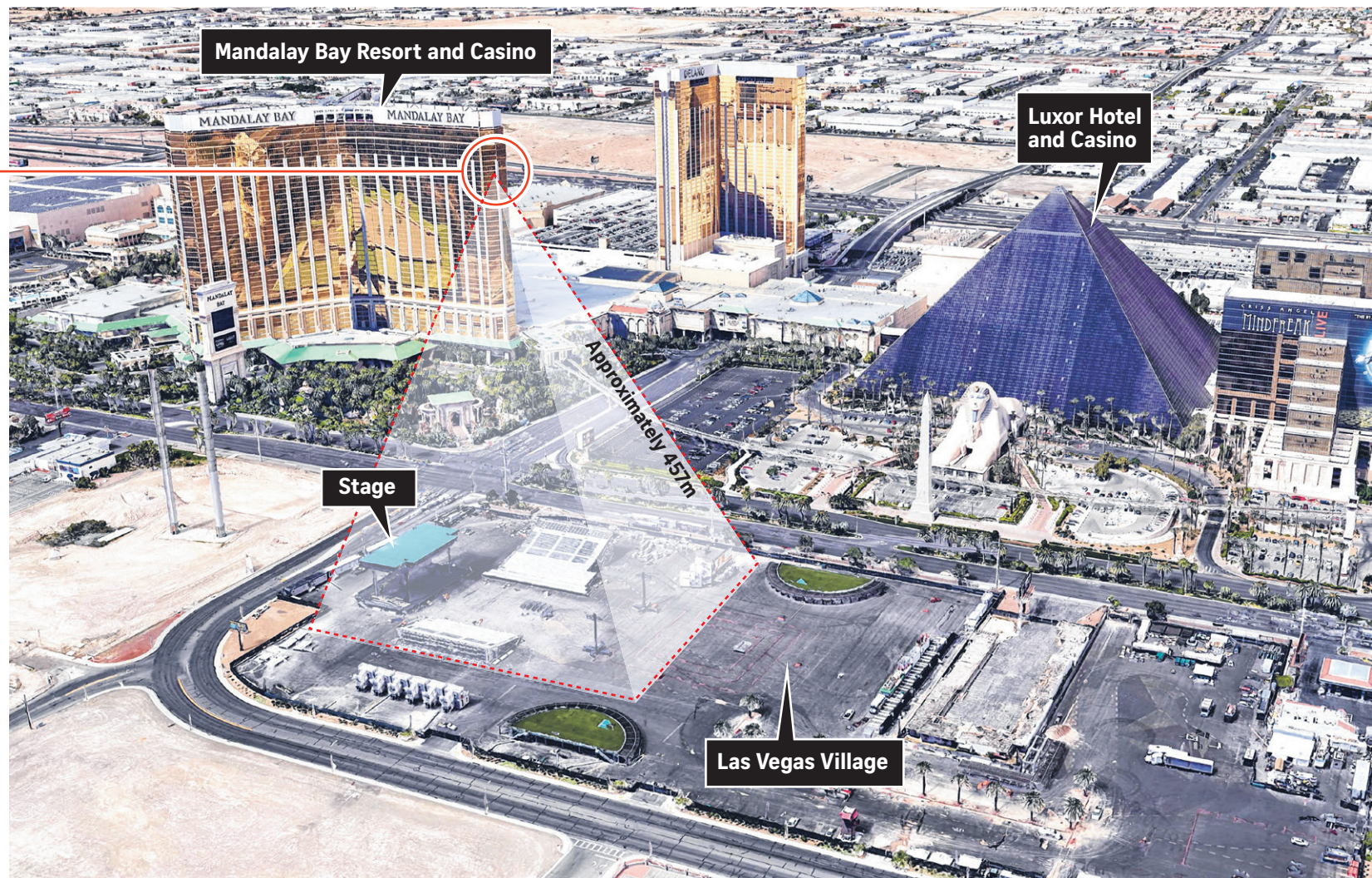
The deadliest mass shooting in US history was facilitated by a massive arsenal and a high vantage point

- Shooting started on Sunday, at 10.08pm (local time)
- At least 59 people were killed and more than 500 injured
- Shooter was on the 32nd floor of Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino
- Gunman found dead when police breached hotel room



## THE GUNMAN

- Stephen Paddock, 64
- Residence: Mesquite, Nevada
- Former accountant, licensed private pilot
- Regular video poker player, known to be wealthy, not known for any religious or political affiliation



## THE ARSENAL

- At least 23 guns, including long rifles, with calibres ranging from .308 to .223, were found inside Paddock's hotel room. They included four Daniel Defense DDM4 rifles and three FN-15s, besides other rifles made by Sig Sauer.

- Some of the firearms had scopes, while two were reportedly modified to make them fully automatic using a "bump stock". Automatic weapons are heavily regulated in the US, but a bump stock is a legal attachment for a weapon that allows a semi-automatic weapon to fire up to 400 to 800 rounds in a minute.

- Paddock also had two rifles mounted on tripods, to keep them steady for firing.
- Officers recovered several pounds of ammonium nitrate, a chemical used to make explosives, from Paddock's car.
- Explosives, 19 firearms and several thousand rounds of ammo were also recovered from his home in Mesquite, Nevada.
