## About Unesco

- Unesco stands for the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural
- Organisation. It is responsible for coordinating international cooperation in education, science, culture and communication
- There are 195 members and 10 associate members.
- Membership of the United Nations carries with it the right to membership of Unesco.
- States that are not members of the United Nations may be admitted to Unesco, upon recommendation
- of the executive board, by a two-thirds majority vote
- of the General Conference. • Territories or groups of territories that are not responsible for the conduct of their international relations may be admitted as associate members.

Their admission and their rights and obligations are

## determined by the General Conference. **NOVEMBER 1945** Unesco founded by 37 countries in the immediate aftermath of World War II. Its purpose: "To contribute to peace and security by promoting collaboration among nations through education, science and culture." 1974 Congress suspends US contribution

## after Unesco criticises Israel and recognises the Palestinian Liberation Organisation – but later rejoins. 1984 Under President Ronald Reagan, US withdraws from Unesco, saying the agency is politically left-wing and financially irresponsible. 1985

Britain and Singapore withdraw, rejoining in 1997 and 2007 respectively. 2003 US rejoins under President George W. Bush.
