
Match points: Arsenal v Tottenham

Alexis Sanchez v Davinson Sanchez



Arsenal's Alexis has only one league goal this season and just one in seven games against Spurs. The collapse of Manchester City's £60 million transfer-deadline bid will only pay off if he gets the goals to fire them into the top four.





Laurent Koscielny v Harry Kane

Koscielny is Arsenal's best defender, but they could do with either Per Mertesacker or Shkodran Mustafi returning to help him halt Kane. The Tottenham top scorer sat out England's stalemates with Germany and Brazil, but is a specialist on these stages. He has six goals in his last five north London league derbies.
