Singapore football under scrutiny

The dire standards of Singapore football, with the national team ranked 173rd globally, were a talking point with MPs querying the progress made by the new Football Association of Singapore (FAS) council elected nearly a year ago. Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth (MCCY) Parliamentary Secretary Baey Yam Keng said the ministry was encouraged by the FAS' moves to boost youth development, build a vibrant football culture and crack down on smoking to raise professionalism.
