

LESS ROOM FOR ENGINE FAILURE

- Drivers are allowed three, down from four, power units this season
- They are limited to only two MGU-K units (Motor Generator Unit-Kinetic) and two energy stores.
- Any additional elements incur grid penalties. Any driver who is handed a penalty of 15 places or more will start from the back

OUT WITH THE OLD

- T-wings and shark-fin style engine covers outlawed
- With two of the most controversial aerodynamic elements on the 2017 F1 cars no longer a feature, the cars will look sleeker between the cockpit and rear wing.
