THE ILYUSHIN IL-62M

• The four-engine Cold War legacy aircraft II-62M has a range of about 10,000km, enabling it to make a non-stop journey from North Korea to the west coast of the United States, or to European cities such as Zurich and Stockholm.

• It is more than capable of the 5,000km trip from Pyongyang to Singapore.

• The long-range narrow-body II-62 was first launched in 1963, and the variant II-62M was developed in the 1970s until production stopped in 1995.

• Mr Kim's aircraft, named Chammae-1, is a VIP configuration similar in scale to the United States' Air Force One.

But Mr Kim (above) has taken to the skies, building a series of small runways long enough to land light, private aircraft next to some of his palaces, satellite imagery shows. The country's state television channel has even shown videos of him piloting planes.
