Lucas Torreira y Bernardo Silva

The £26 million (S\$46 million) Uruguayan Torreira promises to be the defensive midfielder Arsenal have long lacked. He averaged 2.8 tackles per game, more than any Arsenal player, for Sampdoria in Serie A. Silva excelled in the Community Shield win over Chelsea and could start in a central role if Kevin de Bruyne and David Silva are not ready.





Sokratis Papastathopoulos v Sergio Aguero

Papastathopoulos is a short-term signing, a 30-year-old bought to shore up Arsenal's defence. The £17 million Greek will stand in for injured captain Laurent Koscielny. Subduing Aguero, the scorer of five goals in his last six games against Arsenal, will be no simple task. His Community Shield double took him to 201 goals for City.
