
Match points: Chelsea v Arsenal

Jorginho v Aaron Ramsey

Jorginho completed 94 per cent of his passes against Huddersfield and scored a nonchalant penalty but went untested as a defensive midfielder. Ramsey, with Frank Lampard-esque runs, could change that but the Welshman, who was hauled off after just 54 minutes against Manchester City, has to impress to keep his place.





Eden Hazard v Hector Bellerin


Hazard sparkled in a 15-minute cameo in the 3-0 win at Huddersfield, his first appearance since the World Cup, but Willian, who began on the left, was the most effective of Chelsea's starting attackers. Bellerin has been troubled by Chelsea's Marcos Alonso in the past, and may face a battle for his place with new signing Stephan Lichtsteiner.





David Luiz v Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang

Chelsea manager Maurizio Sarri has said he is confident that Luiz can adapt to playing as one of only two centre-backs. While he passed the ball superbly last week, he struggled defensively in the Community Shield. Sarri wants a high defensive line and the electric Aubameyang, one of the quickest strikers around, could find space behind it if Mesut Ozil can pick him out.
