This film unfolds as a competent espionage thriller in the first two acts. The final 30 minutes elevate it to something more – a compelling tale of murky politics and unlikely friendships. The film is loosely based on the true story of Park Chae-seo, a South Korean agent who infiltrated the North's nuclear facilities.
