CARTOONS UNDERGROUND

Out of the more than 1,500 works submitted from 90 countries, 21 will be screened during the single-night event.

One of them is Bigman Businessman (right) from Singaporean Clarisse Chua, now a student of character animation at the California Institute of the Arts. In this gentle satire of office life, Bigman's oversized body does not stop him from working in a company built for normal-sized people, but can he deal with the ostracism?

In the drama What Has To Be (above) from director and animator Jerrold Chong, a couple deal with the death of their firstborn child, even as they await the birth of their second.

Cartoons Underground, now in its seventh year, is billed as Singapore's largest independent animation festival.
