IN AN INSTANT: POLAROID AT THE INTERSECTION OF ART AND TECHNOLOGY

This exhibition on the history of polaroids at the National Museum of Singapore collects more than 220 photos (above) and artefacts related to the iconic instant camera. These include the SX-70 (right) the world's first instant single lens reflex camera - and the "Big Shot", which was popular in the early 1970s among photographers such as American artist Andy Warhol.



The exhibition also endeavours to explore the effect instant photography has on the way people memorialise their lives today.
