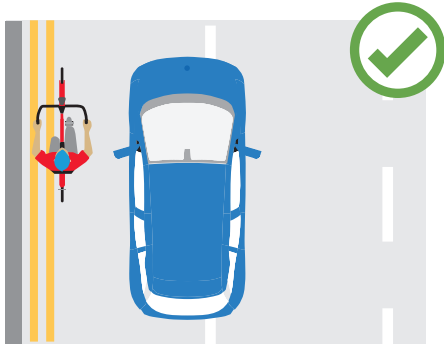


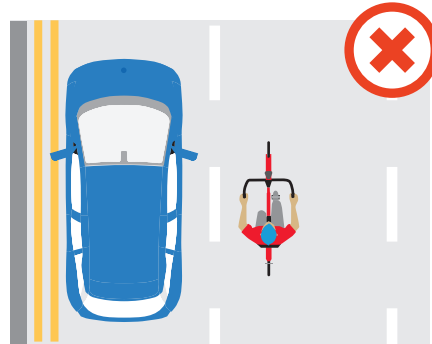
Rules when cycling on the road

UNDER ROAD TRAFFIC RULES, A CYCLIST IS:

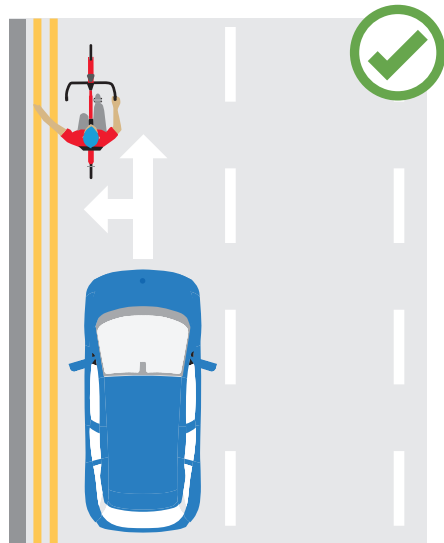
- Required to keep to the left side of the road and not obstruct faster vehicles.



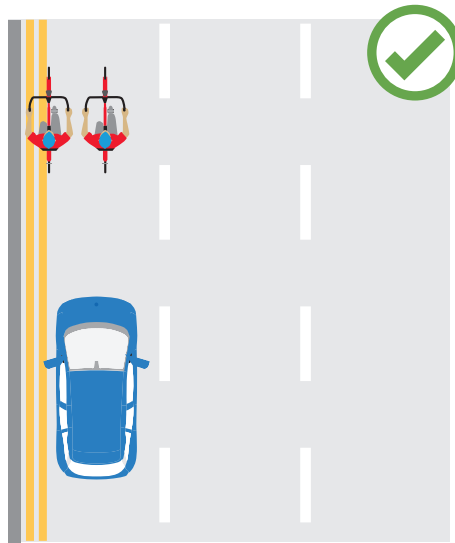
- Prohibited from riding on the right side of a motor vehicle unless he is attempting to overtake it.



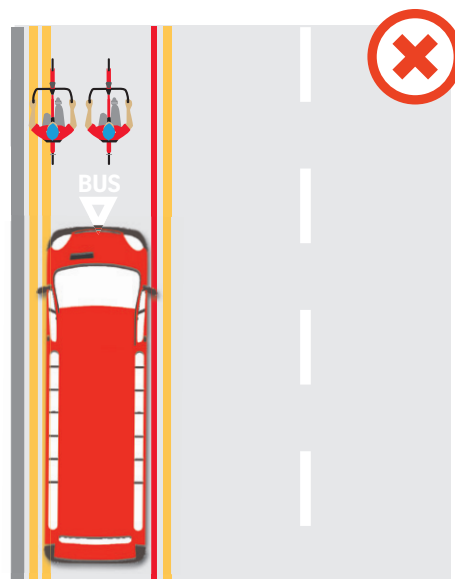
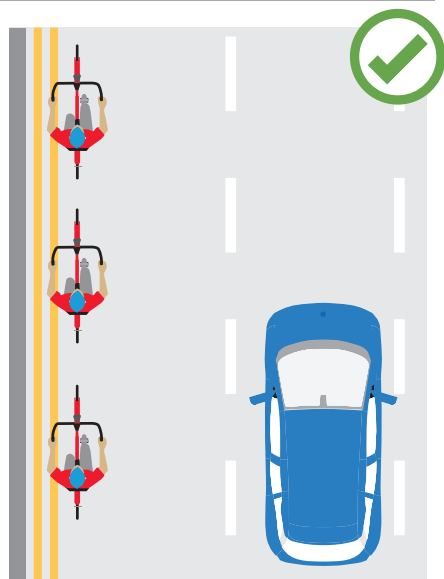
- Required to use hand signals to indicate intention to turn, stop or slow down.



- Allowed to ride two abreast in the same direction on a road with two or more lanes. However this cannot be done in a bus lane.



- Required to ride in an orderly manner, with regard for the safety of others.



TIPS WHEN DRIVING ON THE ROAD

According to Singapore Road Safety Council chairman Bernard Tay, motorists should:



- Follow the road rules and not react rashly or irrationally.



- Not sound the horn aggressively if it is not an immediate emergency. If there is a need to alert others, sound the horn lightly.



- Look out for other road users, like cyclists, and give them sufficient space on the road.



- Be alert and observant.
