SUSPIRIA (R21) 152 minutes/★★★☆☆

Director Luca Guadagnino uses every trick known to modern film prosthetics to create a work that offers more than atmospheric chills. A naive American from a religious family, Susie (Dakota Johnson, left), has come to West Berlin in 1977 to train at an elite modern dance academy. She becomes a star pupil under the tutelage of Madame Blanc (Tilda Swinton). Susie is a witness to a few strange events, such as the disappearance of another student, Patricia (Chloe Grace Moretz). Loosely based on the classic supernatural horror movie of the same name, which was made by Dario Argento and released in 1977.
