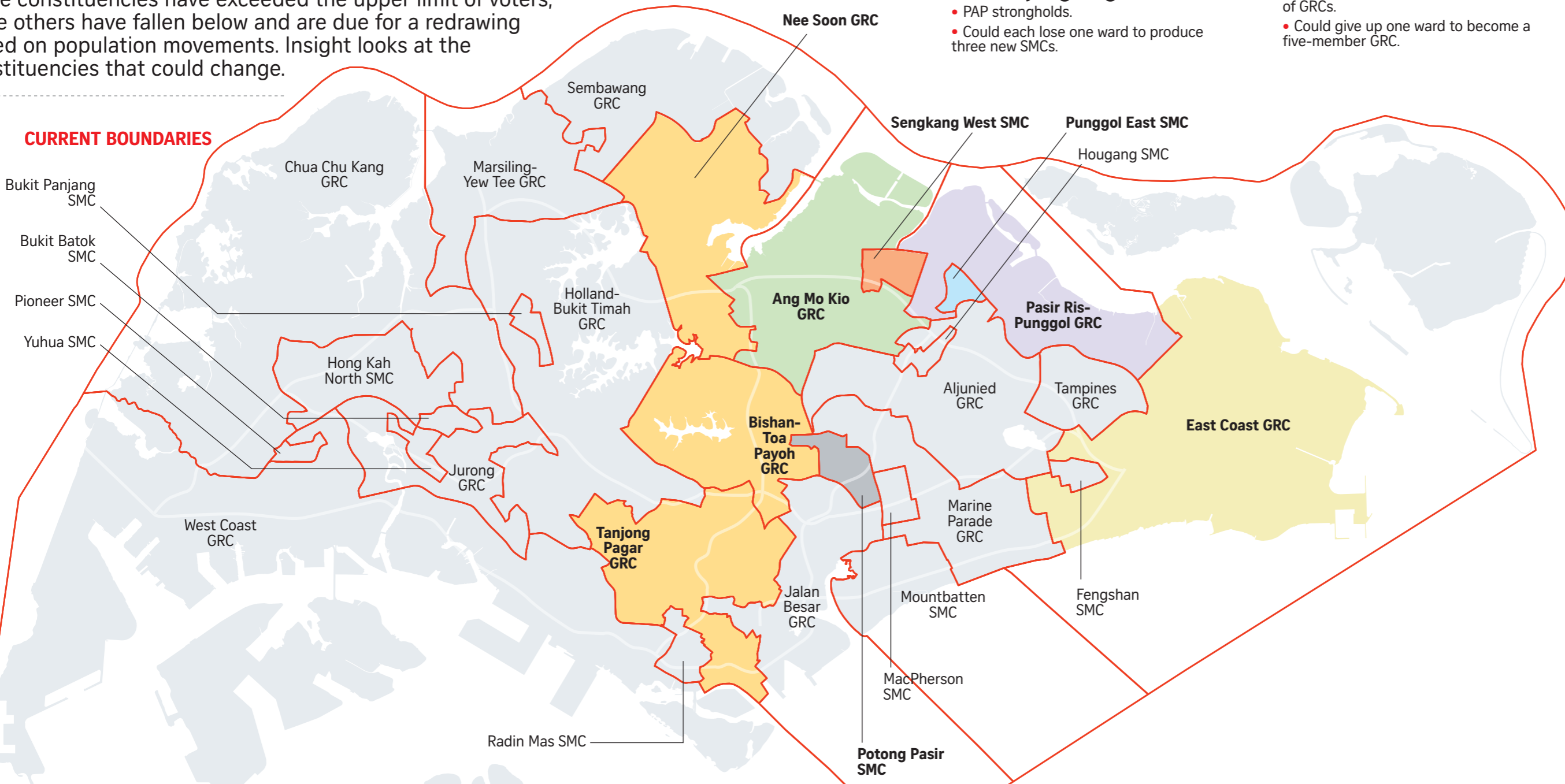


# Ripe for revision

Some constituencies have exceeded the upper limit of voters, while others have fallen below and are due for a redrawing based on population movements. Insight looks at the constituencies that could change.

## CURRENT BOUNDARIES

- Bukit Panjang SMC
- Bukit Batok SMC
- Pioneer SMC
- Yuhua SMC



### Nee Soon, Bishan-Toa Payoh and Tanjong Pagar GRCs

- PAP strongholds.
- Could each lose one ward to produce three new SMCs.

### Ang Mo Kio GRC

- Breaking up the six-man GRC will be in line with the directive to the committee to shrink the average size of GRCs.
- Could give up one ward to become a five-member GRC.

### Sengkang West SMC

- The largest SMC with 47,891 voters, which far exceeds the upper limit of voters set for such constituencies.
- Could become part of a new GRC.

### Punggol East SMC

- Nudging the upper limit of voters set for SMCs. Had been under the Workers' Party from 2013 to 2015 and was won by the PAP by a thin margin in the 2015 GE.
- Could become part of a new GRC.

### Pasir Ris-Punggol GRC

- With 242,225 voters, the six-member GRC has busted the upper limit of the range for such GRCs.
- Could be split into two GRCs, with Senior Minister Teo Chee Hean and Minister in the Prime Minister's Office Ng Chee Meng each helming one.
- Alternatively, parts of it could be hived off to combine with Sengkang West and Punggol East SMCs, as well as parts of Ang Mo Kio GRC, to form a new GRC. The remaining parts could be split into two GRCs.

### East Coast GRC

- Hotly contested in the 2015 GE by the WP. PAP veterans Lim Swee Say and Lee Yi Shyan might retire.
- Boundaries could be rejigged, but no major chop and change expected as the constituency has undergone many changes over the years.

### Potong Pasir SMC

- Number of voters, at 16,739, falls below the lower limit set for SMCs, but this has been the case when the ward was held by opposition veteran Chiam See Tong.
- Expected to remain as an SMC.
