Saudi Arabia's oil production and exports have been disrupted by attacks on two major oil facilities run by state-owned company Saudi Aramco, including the world's biggest petroleum processing facility in Abqaiq. Aramco produced

bpd, were delivered to customers in Asia, its largest-growing demand base. Its Asian buyers include China, India, South Korea, Japan and Taiwan. Its crude deliveries to North America reached more than

Aramco produces, refines and exports oil from Saudi Arabia, but has refining operations across the globe.




