

Overall opinions on implications of fault-line mismanagement

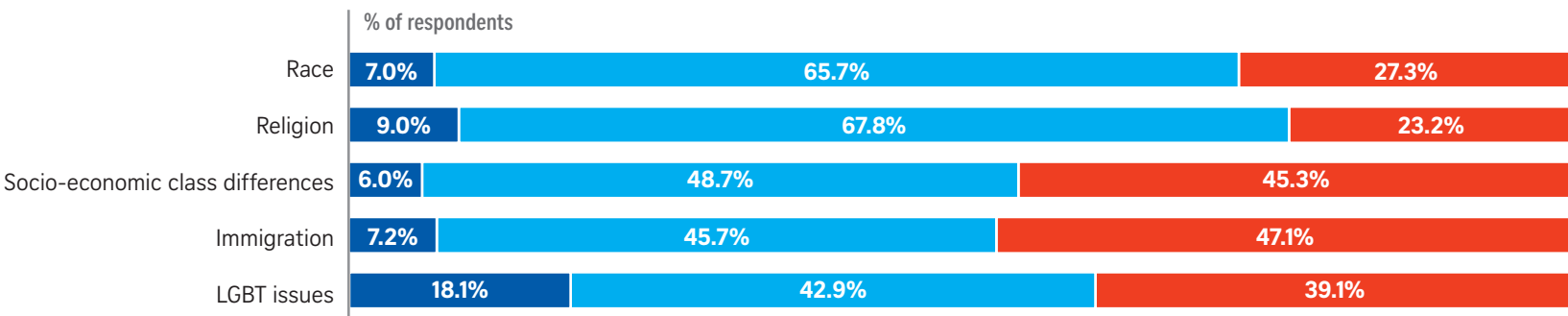
