A Walk of Harmony

A series of free guided tours along Queen, Waterloo and Bencoolen streets covering seven religious institutions will be launched between Nov 23 and March 31 next year. The Straits Times takes a closer look at some highlights along the trail.





🕒 Masjid Bencoolen

• Singapore's second oldest mosque, dating back to 1825

• Currently undergoing progressive renovations

Founded by settlers from Bencoolen in Indonesia
Rebuilt into a

mosque-cum-commercial development in the early 2000s



D Maghain Aboth Synagogue

- Singapore's oldest synagogue
- Consecrated in 1878 and started out with 100 congregants
- Open to visitors, but the public will need to register beforehand on its website



Church of Saints Peter and Paul

- A Catholic church initially established to cater specifically to the Chinese and Indian community
- Still conducts masses in Cantonese, although most services are in English

• Building's architecture also contains some cross-cultural elements that speak of its Chinese heritage



🕞 Kum Yan Methodist Church

- Set up by Cantonese-speaking Christians from China in 1918
- "Kum Yan" means gratitude in Cantonese
- Moved to Queen Street after the war in 1946

• Holds services in Cantonese, English and Mandarin



G Cathedral of the Good Shepherd

• The oldest Roman Catholic church in Singapore

• Differs from other Catholic churches as it is the seat of the Archbishop, who oversees the Catholic parishes here

- Built between 1843 and 1847
- Gazetted as a national monument on June 28, 1973
