

Scolopsis vosmeri This medium-sized fish lives near coral reefs. Although not favoured by anglers due to its small

size, the flesh is sometimes used to make fishballs.

Papillose flathead Sunagocia carbunculus

The body pattern of the papillose flathead camouflages well with the seabed. The fish lies still and waits for passing prey. It feeds on a variety of small fish, crustaceans and molluscs. **Butterfly whiptail** *Pentapodus setosus*

The butterfly whiptail forms small groups and lives near coral reefs. This species is relatively common in near-shore habitats of Singapore.

Masked shrimpgoby Amblyeleotris gymnocephala

This species likes to burrow in sand, coral pieces, shells and small pieces of broken-up shells.
