MARRIAGE STORY (M18)

136 minutes/Netflix/★★★★☆

Writer-director Noah Baumbach (The Squid And The Whale, 2005; Frances Ha, 2012) has a screenplay here that is tipped as the one to beat at coming awards and it is a thing of beauty.

The story moves from comedy to drama and back again without effort, as does the size of the story's focus.

In a flash, it transforms from intimate character study to a satire of how the adversarial nature of the law in California and New York turns the most amicable of uncouplings into knock-down, drawn-out, tooth-and-nail

Off-Broadway playwright Charlie, played by Adam Driver, and his wife and muse, the actress Nicole, played by Scarlett Johansson, are a couple at a crossroads: One of them wants change and the other does not.

Baumbach, at his best, creates indispensable characters, especially in the supporting roles. Viewers will remember Nicole's sister Cassie (Merritt Weaver) as much as they will remember the couple's lawyers, played by Laura Dern, Alan Alda and Ray Liotta. All are wonderful as the three people you meet in divorce hell.

In this painfully funny and tragically sad story, Driver and Johansson deliver outstanding performances as the couple who find that love is only the start; the rest takes practice and luck.



WET SEASON (M18) 103 minutes/★★★☆

Film-maker Anthony Chen's follow-up to Ilo Ilo (2013) finds him less interested in how doing the right thing can drive people into the wrong places, a theme he explored in the earlier film.

Instead, he is out to shove anyone who thinks they have him pegged far, far out of their comfort

This is a character study of a woman stoically struggling with questions about her place in the world. These questions include who she is as a sexual person.

Yeo Yann Yann's Ling is a Chinese-language teacher in a system that treats her subject as a nuisance, an inconvenient roadblock on the path to academic success. She struggles to conceive with husband Andrew (Christopher Lee).

Impregnation has become a job and a source of stress, as is taking care of her paralysed father-in-law. played with deep, wordless pathos by Chinese-language theatre

veteran Yang Shi Bin. While remaining ever the steadfast teacher and dutiful wife on the outside, inside she teeters on the edge of a breakdown, but Chen is too good a storyteller to make it a straightforward story of therapeutic emancipation after she forms a friendship with student Wei

Lun (Koh Jia Ler). Chen lulls the viewer by creating a sense of the familiar - the routines of school, chores of the family home, the downpours that soak the streets but he then makes the camera linger, without judgment, on scenes of intimacy that are joltingly painful to watch.

KNIVES OUT (PG13) 130 minutes/★★★☆

The comedy-tinged murder mystery is a star-studded affair that could have been that most awful of creation: A party in which everyone, except the viewer,

But writer-director Rian Johnson loves cinema too much to let that happen.

This new work expresses Johnson's fondness for the Agatha Christie flick, featuring a "gentleman sleuth of great renown", Benoit Blanc (Daniel Craig, above, deploying an outrageously broad Southern accent), called in to investigate a murder in a mansion that is "practically a Clue board", according to one quest-suspect.

This is a film-maker having fun and who is too smart and empathetic to let things become too clever or nerdy. An array of A-listers, from Toni Collette to Chris Evans to Jamie Lee Curtis, play the suspects. They never look too smugly in on the joke, each turning in earnest performances.
