

DOLEMITE IS MY NAME (R21) 118 minutes/Netflix

The boom in cheap action flicks in the 1970s fuelled the exploitation cinema trend all over the world In Australia, for example, Mel Gibson featured in a low-budget piece called Mad Max (1979) and became a sensation.

In the United States, a stand-up comic called Rudy Ray Moore (Eddie Murphy, left) decided the time was right to fund and star in the Dolemite series of blaxploitation movies.

This biopic captures in all its raunchy, ramshackle glory the rise of an outsider who saw Bruce Lee on screen and wondered: "How hard can it be?" Moore decided to find out and became a star

AN EASY GIRL (R21)

This work with the deliberately titillating title (Une Fille Facile in French) seeks to provoke thinking about women and sexual freedom. Co-writer and director

Rebecca Zlotowski's female buddy comedy pairs two young women the stay-at-home teen Naima

(Mina Farid, above left) and her free-spirited cousin Sofia

(Zahia Dehar, above right). Sofia is instinctively drawn to pleasure and money, an urge that fascinates and repels Naima, who is spending an adventurous summer with her.

The film is not quite the erotic journey some might expect: Naima comes away wiser from the experience in surprising ways.



KNIVES OUT (PG13) 130 minutes/Now showing ★★★☆☆

Writer-director Rian Johnson has a fondness for Agatha Christie flicks. His murder mystery features a "gentleman sleuth of great renown", Benoit Blanc (Daniel Craig, left, deploying an outrageously broad Southern accent), who is invited to sniff out the killer in a group where everyone has a motive.

This is a film-maker having fun, and who is too smart and empathetic to let things become too clever or nerdy.

An array of A-listers - including Toni Collette, Chris Evans and Jamie Lee Curtis - play the suspects. They never look too smugly in on the joke, each turning in earnest performances.
