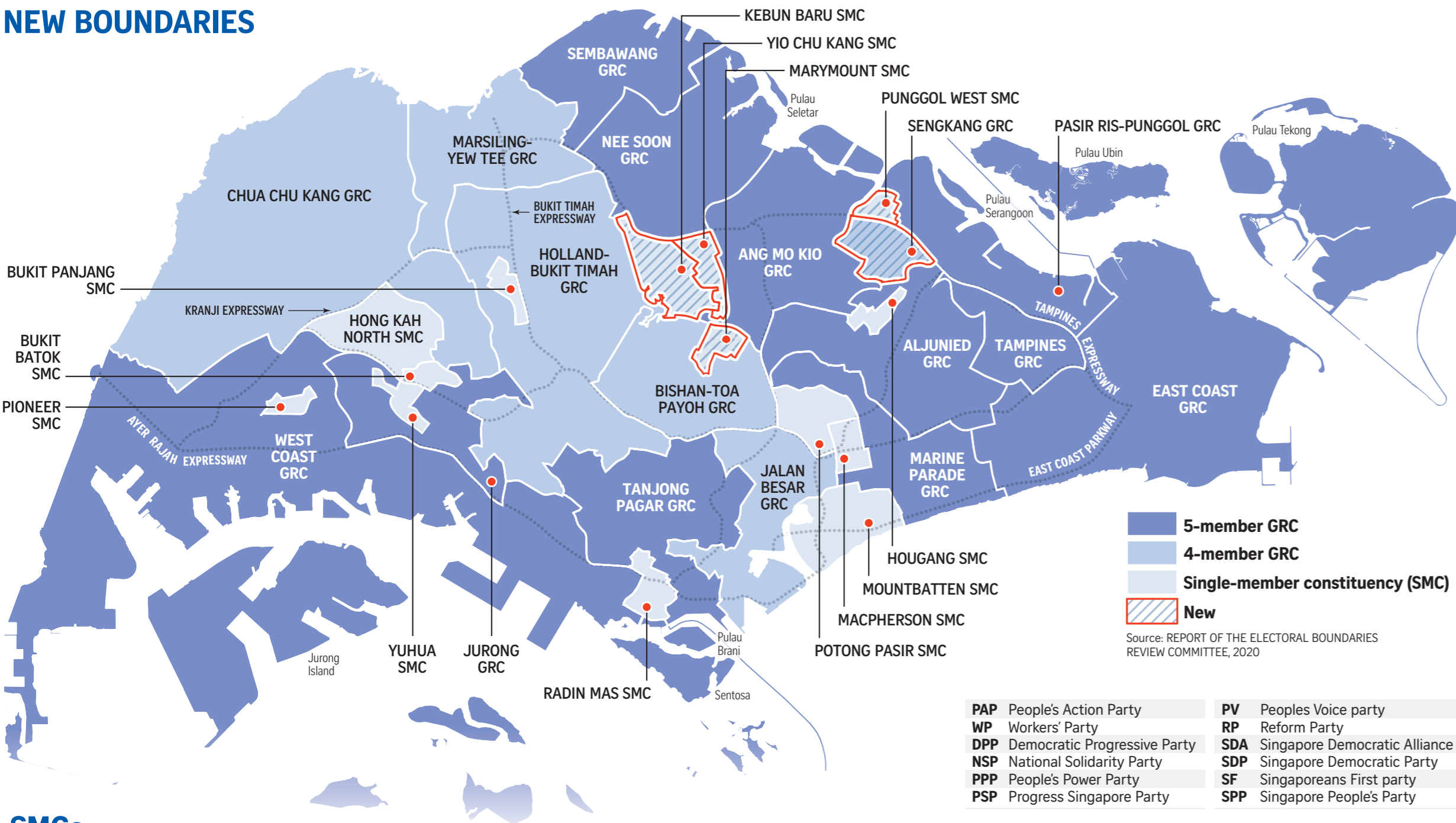


How the electoral landscape has changed

Revised electoral boundaries released last Friday saw four new SMCs and one new GRC formed, and shifts to several other constituencies. We look at how these areas have evolved over the past three elections and how they voted, with those likely to see keener contests listed first.

Few expect the PAP to send a stronger team to Aljunied GRC (below) although some of the WP's time will likely be taken up by the need to defend its top prize, after the shock recount on polling night in GE2015 when it clung on to the GRC by a margin of less than 2 percentage points.
