Using a screenplay based on historian James R. Hansen's 2005 official biography, First Man: The Life Of Neil Armstrong, this film shows astronauts to be as fragile as the rockets that could be either a life support system or funeral pyre, depending on whether tiny mistakes had been made.

Ryan Gosling's (above) Armstrong is a bottled-up, uncommunicative man, traits that make him a great test pilot and mission leader but terrible as a husband and father – and awful as a relatable movie character.
